## **Abstract:**

The book consists of three chapters and 166 sections. It was translated in 2013. Some of the topics covered in this work include: pregnancy management, delivery, fetal temperament, breast milk and its correction, stages of growth and development of the child, nutrition, exercise and dozens of other topics.

**Conclusion:** The book is a valuable resource for pregnancy, childbirth, infant and child medicine.
